## Notes on Competitions

### Drawn Competitions

1. Entry sheets will be posted on the notice board four weeks prior to the event and will close three weeks thereafter when the draw will be made, and the draw sheet posted. The start sheet will also be populated on the BRS online booking system which will generate individual tee-time notifications.
2. Players may not make amendments to the draw sheet. Late entrants should add their names to the 'Reserve list' and indicate an approximate time they would wish to play. The Match & Handicap (M&H) Committee will then allocate a time should one become available and, in that event, the player may take full part in the competition. If your name is on the reserve list and the M&H Committee have not allocated a time prior to the day of the competition, you may still turn up and play if a time is available but only for handicap purposes. The Secretary's Office is happy to assist with entries and withdrawals.
3. A withdrawal sheet will also be posted and players withdrawing from the competition should append their name and time thereto.
4. Within 24-hours of the start of the competition, entrants who are unable to play must inform the starter as soon as possible. Failure to turn up may result in further action which may include a warning and / or suspension from the next drawn medal.
5. Players should play at their draw sheet time unless otherwise directed by the starter and to facilitate smooth running of the competition.

### All competitions

1. All entrants must enter their name on the starting sheet before playing.
2. There will be no medal play prior to 08.00 hrs unless otherwise permitted by the Match & Handicap Committee.
3. There will be no medal play after 17.00 hrs except in Wednesday Medals and Twilight 9-hole events.
4. Four-balls are permitted in individual stroke play events except drawn medals or where otherwise stated.
5. Players must enter their scores into the PSI terminal in the lounge.

### Wednesday Medals

1. For 2020, Wednesday Medals will run each week from 6th May to 26th August.
2. The tee will be reserved exclusively for medal play from 16.00 – 18.00 hours.
3. Four-ball play is not permitted after 15.30 hours.
4. The Midweek Trophy winner will be the player with the best net aggregate of three rounds from the series. A medal will be awarded to the player with the best three round scratch aggregate.

**Twilight 9-hole** – These events will run from 4.00 p.m. on the dates from June to August as detailed in the fixture list. Merging is permitted and should be facilitated at the 11th and 16th tees. Players must 'sign in' on the Club V1 touch screen monitor in the lounge.

### Handicaps

1. To obtain a handicap you should submit three scorecards one of which is off medal tees and all of which have been marked by a member holding a current handicap. **NB: All three cards should be submitted together.**
2. Handicaps will be calculated in accordance with paragraph 15 (3) of the Standard Scratch Score and Handicapping Scheme.
3. To retain your handicap, you must return a minimum of three scores in each season.
4. New members holding a handicap at another club and current members changing their 'Home' club must provide their CDH number and a handicap certificate prior to participating in Club competitions.

### Parking

Members are reminded that they are not permitted to park on the road through the Golf Course or at the site of the machinery shed. Members using the practice ground are however permitted to park their cars in the parking area adjacent thereto. In the main car park, parking is only permitted in designated spaces and parking is not allowed on the grass areas in the vicinity of the clubhouse.

### Club Championship Qualifying

**Men** - Best Two rounds from Three, stroke-play being the sum of gross scores returned in:

Sunday	26 April	Jack Martin (Men) – Championship Qualifier
Sunday	24 May	Mackenzie Cup (Men) – Championship Qualifier
Sunday	21 June	Cochrane Medal (Men) – Championship Qualifier

Qualification will be based on gross (scratch) scores in three handicap Sections  
32 players with handicaps +5 to 12 – Championship and Plate competitions  
16 players with handicaps 13 to 18\* – B Section  
8 players with handicaps 19\* to 28 – C Section  
\* Sections subject to change dependant on numbers playing.

The top 16 scores from players with handicaps +5 to 12 will compete in The Club Championship. The next 16 best scores from players with handicaps +5 to 12 (i.e., qualifiers 17 to 32) will play for the George Farm Memorial Salver. The top 16 scores from players in the B and 8 scores from players in the C sections will play matchplay for their respective championships.

Ties will be arranged based on rank of qualifying score, i.e., 1 v 16, 2 v 15, 3 v 14, etc (1,2,3,4 in different quarters of the draw)

Club Championship matchplay first round ties are to be played by 19th July; second round ties are to be played by 14th August.

All Semi-Finals will be played on Friday 21st August and a Schedule of Ties will be published in advance

All Finals will be played on Sunday 23rd August and a Schedule of Ties will be published in advance.

**Ladies** - The best gross score from either medal round (Strokeplay) played on Saturday 30th or Sunday 31st May. The 8 leading scores from both Silver and Bronze Divisions will proceed to the matchplay stages. The best nett score from either round wins the Mary Gilbert Trophy.

Matchplay quarter-final ties are to be played by 14th August.

## Special Notes on Etiquette

Members are obliged by their very membership to observe the Rules of Etiquette as detailed in The Rules of Golf, Section 1 – Etiquette AND to adhere to the following requirements of Council:

- To always replace divots and to direct the attention of others who fail to do so.
- To maintain reasonable quiet when others nearby are playing.
- To realise that single players have no standing.
- SLOW PLAY** - That three or four ball matches **must** invite two-ball matches to play through when a delay occurs.
- SLOW PLAY** - If a match fails to keep its place on the course and loses one clear hole on the group in front, it should allow the match following to pass through.
- Respect the effort put into the care and maintenance of putting greens by repairing pitch marks. You will make a big difference by routinely repairing more than one on each hole. Repair forks are available from the Pro Shop.
- To always rake over footmarks etc. in bunkers.
- To be properly dressed in the clubhouse and on the course.
- Practice on the course is prohibited.

### Dress Code

- West Linton Golf Club in keeping with many golf clubs operates a dress code which must be observed by all members, guests and visitors to the Club. These rules apply both in the clubhouse and on the course.
- Only appropriate golf attire shall be worn on the course. Denims and football colours are prohibited.
- No shoes worn on the course will be worn in the clubhouse and no caps or hats will be worn in the lounges or dining area.
- In the clubhouse there is no requirement for jacket and tie but the above code applies except that 'smart' denim jeans and training shoes are permitted.
